Transfers relevant monies as ring fenced from the received grant on receipt of suitable invoices / receipts. 3. That the Parish Council considers at a future date the ownership of capital items previously paid via received grant funds.
<p>Background Information:</p> <p>Insert as much information as possible so that councillors have the detail, they need to make an informed decision e.g., cost, time, long term/short term project, where, how, when why??</p>	<p>Spud Club was formed out of a Parish Council bid to the Local Welfare Scheme in Summer 2024.</p> <p>After a “dress rehearsal” at the end of July the Spud Club has been open every Monday since the 5th August and hosted by the Methodist Church. Spud Club numbers have risen over this period and over 100 potatoes have been served in the weeks of 7th, 14th & 21st October. Volunteer opportunities and numbers are also increasing.</p> <p>On 21st October the Spud Club held a general meeting where a constitution was approved to allow for the opening of a bank account independent of the Methodist Church and Parish Council and seek sponsorship and grant funding. The new committee allows for the co-option of a member of the parish council to serve on its committee.</p> <p>Presently three capital purchases have been made from the ringfenced grant funds. These are the potato oven, the trolley that holds the oven and a bain-marie.</p> <p>Technically these are the property of the Parish Council.</p>

	<p>The venue and numbers have allowed for “pop-up” stalls and visits from Neighbourhood watch, Police, Public Health and our local MP.</p> <p>Future engagement sessions are proposed with NWBC’s financial inclusion team, the local credit union, fire services and the provision of local health checks.</p>
